

From the Pastor's Desk

This Sunday is the Rite of Election in Columbus with Bishop Campbell. We are blessed to have a number who are preparing to enter the Church. Please pray for all of those discerning the call from the Lord to enter the Catholic Church this year.

There has been some question about the finances of St. Peter and the rest of the consortium. I want to reiterate what I said earlier: there is not and will not be any commingling of funds. St. Peter and St. Colman and St. Mary and St. Sylvester Parishes are all separate entities under the diocese of Columbus. I meet with a Finance Council from each parish, not a combined one. The books are all kept separate, not combined. The bank accounts are all kept separate, not combined.


What sometimes leads to confusion over this is that St. Colman and St. Sylvester bookkeeping services are currently being performed by the bookkeeper of St. Peter Church. That is, St. Colman and St. Sylvester employ the bookkeeper at St. Peter's to handle all of the finances and bookkeeping of the parishes. This is also why we have had to shift some of the work from the administrative assistant (responsible for bookkeeping/secretarial work) to the secretary and increase the secretary's hours. The bookkeeper is now also working for two other parishes in a sense. So although, our bookkeeper provides the financial work to these other two, St. Peter's is not paying that portion of her wages – that is covered by the respective parishes, and thus there has been no increased wage expense to St. Peter's, even though the secretary is working more hours. I hope this clears up any confusion (and didn't make it more confusing ©). I once again thank you for your continued generous support of our parish and its mission to the wider community. Know that the Finance Council and I take seriously our role in being good stewards of the resources you direct to the Lord through your parish offerings.

On another note, thanks to all who supported the sisters and I in our bid to win the clergy cook-off again. Although we didn't win this time, it was still a lot of fun and raised money for a good cause (our seminarians!).
