Miryante Orphanage donation suggestions: Several people have asked about sending gifts to the children they sponsor at Miryante Orphan's Home. If anyone has tried to mail a package there they know how very expensive that is to do. Click on "donations" at the top of the page and pick a category from the drop down menu (you can choose any category, but "Management Fund" is recommended). From there you can make a one-time donation. A donation of around \$10.00 will give the child an opportunity to go shopping for a new outfit in the neighboring village. Some people have also asked about sponsoring an activity such as a special meal including meat and rice (maize and beans are what the children eat on a daily basis). This can be done for around \$100.00. An activity such as a dance or game day can be funded for about \$50.00. This, too, can be done via a one-time donation on the website.
