

#### From the Pastor's Desk

It's time for Lent already. Make this a great Lent by following these four steps:

- 1) Start off with Ash Wednesday, this Wednesday. We will be having a Mass here at 8:30 a.m. and 7:30 p.m., as well as at Bishop Flaget at 10:00 a.m. If you are in the Waverly area, St. Mary's Mass will be at 5:30 p.m. Plenty of opportunities to start Lent off right!
- 2) Attend the Catholic men's or women's conference in Columbus. These are very high-quality conferences that are now held annually in our diocese. Each year, attendance at each of these exceeds 2,000. Both conferences have excellent speakers and beautiful liturgies, as well as the opportunity for Confession. The women's conference is Saturday, February 20. The men's conference is the following Saturday (February 27). Register for the events at columbuscatholicwomen. com or columuscatholicmen.com.
- 3) Attend Eucharistic Adoration during Lent. We have Adoration every Thursday from 9:00 a.m.-9:00 p.m. Make a commitment to visit with the Lord more this Lent.
- 4) Follow the disciplines of the Church: A reminder on the disciplines of these forty days:
  - A. Lent is the penitential season of the Church's year. It runs from Ash Wednesday to the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. There are six Sundays in Lent. The sixth is named Passion (or Palm) Sunday and starts Holy Week.
  - B. To FAST means to eat one full meal and two lesser meals. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of FAST, and are kept by those age 18 to 59. One is encouraged to fast on other days, too, throughout the year.
  - C. To ABSTAIN means to refrain from eating meat, and soups or gravies made from meat. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of abstinence, as are all Fridays in Lent. Catholics aged 14 and older are bound to abstain from meat.
  - D. We may observe fast and abstinence on other days, of course. Other practices, such as daily Mass, Bible reading and study, extra prayer, the Way of the Cross, works of mercy, almsgiving, etc., are highly encouraged and not limited to Lent.

Let's go deeper with the Lord this Lent!


