12 Promises of The Sacred Heart of Jesus

1. I will give them all Graces necessary in their state of Life.
2. I will give Peace in their families that are divided.
3. I will console them in their troubles.
4. I will be their Refuge during life and above all in death.
5. I will bestow the Blessings of Heaven on all their enterprises.
6. Sinners shall find My Heart the Source and infinite ocean of Mercy.
7. Tepid souls shall become fervent.
8. Fervent souls shall rise quickly to great perfection.
9. I will bless those places wherein the image of My Heart shall be exposed and honored and will imprint My Love on the hearts of those who would wear this image on their person. I will also destroy in them all disordered movements.
10. I will give to Priests who are animated by a tender devotion to my Divine Heart the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.
11. Those who promote the Devotion shall have their names written in My Heart never to be effaced.
12. I promise you in the excessive Mercy of My Heart that My all Powerful Love will grant to those who communicate on the First Friday in nine consecutive months, the Grace of final penitence: they will not die in my disgrace, nor without receiving their Sacraments. My Divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment.



A few weeks ago, Fr. Hahn mentioned in his homily some of the ways in which St. Peter's has been present to the poor and outcast in our community; here is another little-known expression of this. Most of our parishioners are unaware that for years, St. Peter's has supported an unusual informal "partnership" with some of the inmates at Chillicothe Correctional (CCI). For years, the community service **inmates** along with the inmates from "Reintegration" have been assembling and boxing rosaries for institutions (hospitals, prisons, schools, etc.). In fact, the inmates have also made thousands of rosaries for Fr. Thomas Blau for his retreats (remember last year's parish retreat?). This is in addition to hundreds of rosaries we distribute at the Ross County Fair and in our own programs. The Mental Health Department at CCI recently reported that since April 2014, CCI inmates have made over 42,000 rosaries. From time to time, I pick up 10-15 boxes of 200 rosaries from CCI, and the rosaries are mailed around the country and around the world, and the generosity of St. Peter's has been covering postage. If you would like to become part of this unusual ministry, you can do so by helping to defray some of the cost of postage. Feel free to make a donation on Sundays, indicated on the envelope that it is for the CCI rosary support.
