Confirmation

This weekend, Bishop Campbell celebrates the Sacrament of Confirmation for 8th Graders of St. Peter and St. Mary. We pray for an outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon these young Christians and openness to all of the gifts of the Spirit. We also pray for a renewal of our own confirmations and our own openness to the fullness of the gifts of the Spirit.

Office Changes

Over the last year or two, I have been trying to figure out how I might shift some of the administrative burden at St. Peter. With four parishes now, there are a lot more administrative concerns. For just one example, with parish and Finance Councils, even reducing the number of meetings I attend at each parish to once a quarter that leads to 16 parish Council meetings and 16 Finance Council meetings. Fr. Hartge and Fr. Dooley are doing an excellent job as parochial vicar administrators at their respective parishes, but there is still always a number of decisions, etc., that only the Pastor can make.

At the beginning of our time at Washington Court House, we switched to an Office Manager structure for St. Colman in which we hired a person to do a lot of the managerial oversight that the Pastor would normally do. This helped things greatly to the point that I now am going to restructure our parish leadership in the same way.

I have hired our present part-time Secretary, Jenny French, as the new Office Manager. She will still provide secretarial services, but will also handle some of the management of the day-to-day operations, becoming the Immediate Supervisor for all non-Pastoral Staff. She will also be the first point of contact for many of the decisions regarding the operations and "business" aspects of the Church, overseeing our rentals, special projects, and the such. Donna Weisenberger, current Administrative Assistant, has been hired as our Bookkeeper. She will be exclusively bookkeeping, so please begin directing any other inquiries not related to bookkeeping to Jenny, so that the transition can more quickly be complete and the new structure provide the order that I am looking for.

The other thing that will change slightly is our office hours. They will soon be Monday-Thursday, 9:00 a.m.-12:00 noon and 1:00-4:00 p.m. (rather than 4:30 p.m.), and Friday, 9:00 a.m.-12:00 noon. In the fall, we plan to add office hours in between the Sunday Masses to provide the opportunity for parishioners to have access to the office particularly if their work schedules prevent them from being able to come to the office during the weekday hours.

Jenny will begin as Office Manager beginning next Monday, June 19. I thank Jenny, Donna, and all of our Staff for their hard work, dedication, and zeal which help make serving here such a joy.
