



From the Desk of Fr. Hartge:

In his 1980 encyclical *Dives in Misericordia* (The Mercy of God), St. John Paul II writes, “The Church proclaims the truth of God’s mercy revealed in the crucified and risen Christ, and she professes it in various ways. Furthermore, she seeks to practice mercy toward people through people, and she sees in this an indispensable condition for solicitude for a better and “more human” world, today and tomorrow. However, at no time and in no historical period – especially at a moment as critical as our own – can the Church forget *the prayer that is a cry for the mercy of God* amid the many forms of evil which weigh upon humanity and threaten it. Precisely this is the fundamental right and duty of the Church in Christ Jesus, her right and duty toward God and toward humanity. The more the human conscience succumbs to secularization, loses its sense of the very meaning of the word “mercy,” moves away from God and distances itself from the mystery of mercy, the more *the Church has the right and the duty* to appeal to the God of mercy “with loud cries.” These “loud cries” should be the mark of the Church of our times, cries uttered to God to implore his mercy, the certain manifestation of which she professes and proclaims as having already come in Jesus crucified and risen, that is, in the Paschal Mystery (DiM 15).”

Truly the mercy of God comes to us in the person of Jesus Christ, who reveals the Father of mercies to us. The more the world moves away from Christ, the more humanity loses its sense of who we are as made in the image and likeness of God, and the more we search for meaning in our lives in other self-destructive ways. Our loud cries of prayer should be for those who do not know Christ, who deny the true meaning of their sexuality, who promote sexual identity as something superfluous or changeable to the individual, who are denied their basic rights especially the right to freedom of religion, and those whose basic material and spiritual needs are not met or ignored. These areas and many more are in desperate need of true mercy, which is found in the person of Christ.

Here at St. Peter, the Divine Mercy Chaplet will be sung at 3:00 this Sunday afternoon. Following 11:30 a.m. Mass and prior to the chaplet, there will be Adoration in the church as well.

In this season of Easter, let us truly be people of mercy. Let us be those people who have experienced mercy in the risen Christ and those who desire to give what we have received. As John Paul II said, this is our *right and duty*. May the mercy of God penetrate the deepest desires of our hearts.

Presence to the Poor...Helping our St. Vincent de Paul Society with its mission is an excellent way to be a presence to the poor and to perform corporal works of mercy.

Feeding the Hungry – Donate items to the Food Pantry – current needs are canned fruit, corn, and peas, pasta meals in pull top cans, pasta sauce, cereal, tuna, peanut butter, and soup.

Clothing the Naked – When you donate items to Goodwill, ask for Donation receipt and bring to the St. Vincent de Paul Society. They are given credit for each bag of clothing given and can use to offset the cost of the vouchers they give to those in need of clothing.

Alms for the Poor – This can be accomplished by several means available here at St. Peter. Support the St. Vincent de Paul Society during their 5th Sunday Collections and using the monthly envelope. Supporting other local agencies, such as the Assistance House, Love Inc., and the Good Samaritan Food Pantry with monetary donations.

The Christian community described in Acts understood and practiced *total* stewardship. St. Paul reports that the believers did not claim anything as their own, but held everything in common, and distributed to each whatever was needed.

Filmed in stunning 4K and seamlessly weaving together theology and history with modern testimonials and visual effects, this stirring film creates a remarkable tapestry of what constitutes the face of mercy in our modern world.

Meet the woman who found freedom in forgiveness after seeing her family wiped out by genocide; the former-NFL linebacker who walked away from football to share Christ's mercy with the homeless; the baseball player who traded MLB ambitions for the monastery; the priest with a drug-dealing past, and the young widow who chose mercy towards her husband's killer. These moving testimonies will remind us all that Divine Mercy is not just a devotion of the past or some abstract theology – it is alive, it is present, and it will transform the world.

This movie is not rated, but was created with an adult audience in mind. It contains scenes of war and historic violence. We would recommend Parental Guidance and that parents preview it before watching with children.
