

From the Pastor's Desk

Well if all went as planned, I should be back in the consortium when you are reading this bulletin. I thank God for the gift of a wonderful sabbatical and I thank the priests, sisters, staff, and parishioners of our consortium for their support and prayers during this time away for renewal. As was mentioned at the beginning of May in my pastor column "from afar," I ended up changing the plan somewhat (or now in hindsight God changed the plan somewhat).

I originally intended to spend the entire sabbatical in the Holy Land but in the end spent half there and half in Scotland. The first half was a great time of ministry, but it wasn't a sabbatical rest. On the other hand, there's no substitute for being in the land where Our Lord walked and having the opportunity every day to share the message of Jesus Christ and His Resurrection with people from all over the world who were visiting the site. The site, as mentioned before, was Magdala – the town where Mary Magdalene came from and where the ruins of the synagogue from the time of Jesus was recently unearthed.

In the meantime, construction on the new guesthouse/hotel in Magdala had begun, which meant work was going on around (and at times IN) my room from 6:00 a.m. until 10:00 p.m., so even on off times, there wasn't much chance for rest and study. After discussing with my Spiritual Director, I settled on Pluscarden Abbey in Northern Scotland for the second half of my sabbatical.

This was the perfect place for a sabbatical: ancient monastery and church, solitude, chanting of the psalms, endless opportunity for prayer and study, and all of this is in a setting surrounded by thousands of acres of hills, forests, and hiking trails. On top of all of this, the weather stays in the upper 50s and 60s most days – so perfect for all of these things. I can't thank the Lord enough for allowing me that time with Him away from the bustle of the world.

However, after three months, I must admit that I have been missing seeing you all and am happy to be returning to my church family. Hopefully that is still the case when you are reading this, which will be about 24 hours after I've returned ③. Speaking of family and missing people, I was sad for us and happy for him to hear of Fr. Hartge's appointment as pastor of the Perry County Consortium. I had been worried that he would be transferred this summer. He has been a great blessing and it will be sad to say goodbye. However, a parishioner helped me put it in perspective when he described it as kind of like his experience of being a volleyball coach in JV. He said when you see your player get moved up to Varsity because they are doing so well, you are sad to see them leave, but happy that they are now moving on. He said that's how he's looking at Fr. Hartge's move. I think it's a good way! Fr. Hartge is ready to become a pastor and not only a pastor but the pastor of a consortium where he'll oversee the four parishes of Perry County and will be assisted by a younger priest (hard to believe there are some younger than him ③).

Come say Good Bye and Thanks to Fr. Hartge, as we celebrate our Parish Picnic and Farewell, this Sunday evening.



Presence to the Poor...Helping our St. Vincent de Paul Society with its mission is an excellent way to be a presence to the poor and to perform corporal works of mercy. Hope Clinic is also in need of various volunteers, especially nurses.

Feeding the Hungry – Donate items to the food pantry. Current needs are <u>canned fruit</u>, <u>corn</u>, <u>and peas</u>, <u>pasta meals in pull-top cans</u>, <u>pasta sauce</u>, <u>cereal</u>, <u>tuna</u>, <u>peanut butter</u>, and SOUP.

THE CATHOLIC FAITH. PICK OF THE WEEK, July 1, 2018:

Christians and many non-Christians have long accepted Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John – the four Gospels of the New Testament – as the only reliable accounts of the life and teaching of Jesus of Nazareth. Recent media stories and certain best-selling books have alerted the public to alternative writings about Jesus, leading many people – including many believers – to wonder why we should consider only the



four New Testament Gospels as "Gospel truth." The alternative writings about Jesus bear the names of such prominent early Christians as Peter, Thomas, Mary Magdalene, Judas, James, and Andrew. Some of these writings purport to contain "secret" teachings of Jesus, to recount his childhood, or to fill in other gaps in this story. Some contradict the New Testament. What should informed believers and nonbelievers make of them? Were they written by disciples of Jesus as they claim? How do they compare with the New Testament Gospels? Are these works "lost gospels" or "false gospels"? In this thought-provoking DVD, top scholars of early Christian writings answer these and other crucial questions. They discuss the relationship between these works and the New Testament. The experts also explore Gnostic writings such as the "Gospel of Thomas" and the "Gospel of Judas," and they reveal startling facts about the groups who composed them.
