**Presence to the Poor...** Helping our St. Vincent de Paul Society with its mission is an excellent way to be a presence to the poor and to perform corporal works of mercy. Hope Clinic is also in need of various volunteers, especially nurses.

**Feeding the Hungry** – Donate items to the food pantry. Current needs are **canned fruit, corn, and peas, pasta meals in pull-top cans, pasta sauce, cereal, tuna, peanut butter, and SOUP.**

**Clothing the Naked** – When you donate items to Goodwill, ask for a Donation receipt and bring it to the St. Vincent de Paul Society. They are given credit for each bag of clothing given, which can be used to offset the cost of the vouchers they give to those in need of clothing.

**Alms for the Poor** – This can be accomplished by several means available here at St. Peter. Supporting the St. Vincent de Paul Society during its 5th Sunday Collections and using the monthly envelope. Support other local agencies, such as the Assistance House, Love Inc., and the Good Samaritan Food Pantry with monetary donations.

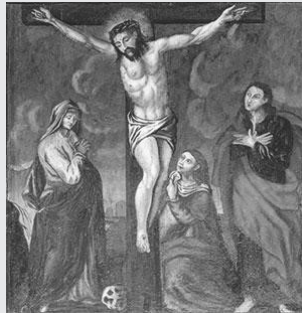

# Year of the Family

## Living the Liturgical Year

*Celebrating Saints and Feasts to Enrich Hearts and Homes.*



### September 14: Exaltation of the Holy Cross

This feast commemorates the recovery of the Holy Cross of Christ (originally found in the Holy Land by St. Helena) from the Persians and its return to Jerusalem by Emperor Heraclius in the 7th Century.

Legend has it that the Emperor (in all his fine robes and jewels) could not advance into Jerusalem with the Cross until he humbled himself, put on penitential clothes and proceeded as a barefoot pilgrim.

This Feast is a twofold reminder that:

- 1) we, as followers of Christ Crucified, must also take up our crosses daily,
- and 2) Jesus triumphed over death and draws us to Himself (see John 12:32).

It is said that the hill where St. Helen found the cross was covered with sweet basil.  
That makes this easy meatless recipe perfect for this feast.

### RECIPE: Basil Pesto Pasta with Tomatoes (serves 4-6)

#### *Ingredients:*

- 1 6 oz jar of pesto
- 1 16 oz box pasta of choice
- 2 cups cherry tomatoes, halved
- 1/c cup grated parmesan cheese
- salt and pepper to taste

#### *Directions:*

Cook pasta according to package directions, drain and return to pot.  
Gently stir in pesto. Place pasta on serving dishes and garnish with fresh tomatoes and grated parmesan.  
Serve with a loaf of crusty bread.
